“Unique Native Plants of the Malcolm Bluff Shores, Niagara Escarpment”

Ontario Nature and the Bruce Trail Conservancy are in the process of acquiring 1045 acres of unfragmented forest and Georgian Bay shoreline along the Niagara Escarpment on the Bruce Peninsula. The property supports a wide variation of habitats and several rare plant species.

Presenter: Conservation Science Manager. Mark manages Ontario Nature's 22 nature reserves (almost 6,000 acres), located across southern and eastern Ontario and protecting many rare and at-risk native plants including endangered orchids and ferns.
